The Alumni Small Grant (ASG) is a unique funding opportunity for United States Government (USG) exchange alumni. With continued support from the U.S. Embassy in Nepal, this marks the third edition of the ASG program which is administered by NUSAN.

The ASG 2025 grant aims to enhance the professional skills of exchange while supporting alumni government priorities and policies. Based on these objectives, thematic areas for ASG 2025 include: combating illegal immigration, opportunities, creating job enhancing entrepreneurial skills in Nepal.







## Celebrating Nepali New Year 2082 with USG Alumni


